

HISTORY 6

Course Description: In this course, students will learn about the Creation; the Dispensations of Adam, Enoch, Noah, Abraham, Moses, Christ and Apostles; the Apostasy; and the Renaissance, Civilizations of focus include the World, Mesopotamia (Israel, Egypt, Assyria, and Babylon), Greece, Rome, and Byzantine Empire, and Europe. Students will learn through the principle approach methodology (researching, reasoning, relating, and recording) while preparing oral reports, maps, notebooks, and powerpoints. In addition to being able to discuss their learning, students will demonstrate their understanding of these topics through weekly quizzes and bi-monthly tests (written and oral). Some will require a memorization of facts while others will demonstrate depth and understanding of key concepts discussed and their relation to the seven principles of American Christian Education. We will also use activity sheets and 4 written history reports throughout the year. The most reliable way to receive specific information about course work, including topics and timing, is through the teacher's weekly email. For many students, the most challenging part of class is to memorize the vast amount of people, places and events in History/Geography. To support your student, please consider drilling Middle East and European geography and key places and events connected with each civilization. Discuss with your students the seven principles of American Christian Education as they relate to the Old Testament and World Civilization history.
